and students of **Kai Leung's Shotojuku Dojo** from Astoria, Queens join acclaimed cellist/pianist/composer **Dave Eggar** and his quartet for *Balance in Two Worlds*, a match up between traditional martial arts and classical music this April at Lincoln Center's new David Rubenstein Atrium on Manhattan's Upper West Side.

Balance in Two Worlds will be presented in two parts: April 3 at 11 a.m. in an informal, behind-the-scenes program, featuring performance excerpts, demonstrations, questions and answers and audience participation, as part of **Meet the Artist Saturdays** designed for family audiences; and on April 8 at 8:30 p.m. in full performance, as part of the **Target® Free Thursdays** series at the Atrium.

The David Rubenstein Atrium at Lincoln Center is located at Broadway between 62nd and 63rd Streets. FREE admission; no tickets required. Seating is limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis. The 'wichcraft cafe, serving food and drinks, is open before, during and immediately following the performance.

For ***Balance in Two Worlds***, the martial artists—led by Shihan Kai Leung and Sensei James Luk—coordinate the deadly but beautiful movements of Shotokan Karate-do to the music of George Crumb’s haunting *Voice of the Whale*, and works of Schumann and Chopin, performed by the extraordinary artists of the Dave Eggar Quartet in this unique collaboration between two disciplines that share much in common. Both require rigorous training based on long-established, formal structures, combine art and science, and strive to achieve dramatic displays of solo beauty as well as dynamic interaction with other “performers.”

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Shotokan Karate-do is the most popular style of Karate in the world, practiced by millions. It emphasizes rigorous physical training to develop the clean linear and powerful focus techniques that we see today. The style emphasizes the practices of striking techniques with the arm, along with leg blocks, evasions and a strong offense as a defense. Shotokan Karate-do can be practiced as a form of sport as well as for self defense. Influenced by earlier forms of Chinese martial arts, Karate originated on Okinawa, later spreading to mainland Japan.

Shihan Kai Leung and his Shotojuku Dojo

A former karate tournament champion and widely-recognized expert in self-defense, **Shihan Kai Leung**, Master Instructor of the Shotojuku, is a founding member of the International Shotokai Karate-do Federation, which is headquartered at his dojo. Shihan started training in martial arts in 1964, obtained his black belt in 1967 and began formally teaching in the early 1970s. He has received numerous awards over the past four decades. The Miyazaki Dojo Astoria Honbu was founded by Master Toyotaro Miyazaki and Shihan Kai Leung in 1982. From 1978-1982, he was assistant instructor at Master Miyazaki’s Tokutai Dojo in Flushing, before establishing the Miyazaki Dojo Astoria branch. Leung is the highest ranked instructor and disciple of Master Miyazaki. **Shihan Kai Leung’s Dojo** has produced some of this country’s most outstanding students, many of whom have gone on to become national and international champions, esteemed Karate teachers and noted self defense instructors. Sensei James Luk started Shotokan Karate training at the age of six with Shihan Kai Leung at this Shotojuku Dojo in Astoria, where he has trained for the past 20 years. Sensei Luk has achieved the rank of Yon-Dan (4th Degree Black Belt). He is one of Shihan Kai Leung’s most highly-ranked instructors and has

taught at the Dojo since 2000. In addition to Karate, Luk has studied the traditional arts of Peking Opera, Chinese acrobatics and Chinese folk dance. He performs frequently with Dance China New York. For more information visit: www.lukdojo.com

Dave Eggar's work is consistently greeted with superlatives and rave reviews, whether he's working in Pop, Rock, Jazz, R&B, New Age, World or Classical music. A musical prodigy, he began playing the cello and piano at age three and by the age of seven had performed on Broadway and with the Metropolitan Opera. He debuted at Carnegie Hall at fifteen. Eggar has appeared worldwide as a solo cellist and pianist. A virtuoso of many styles, he has performed and recorded with many noted artists including Evanescence, The Who, Coldplay, Beyoncé, Pearl Jam, Fall Out Boy, Dave Sanborn, Ray Lamontagne, Roberta Flack, The Spin Doctors, Dianne Reeves, Phil Ramone, Hannah Montana, Duncan Sheik, Sinéad O'Connor, Bon Jovi, and Manhattan Transfer, among others. Dave's soon-to-be released, fourth solo CD project and companion DVD video, ***Kingston Morning***, was recorded in Brooklyn, NY, Kingston, Jamaica, and Big Stone Gap, Virginia. It will be released by Domo Music Group (www.domo.com) in late April 2010. Critically acclaimed tracks on the CD include **Earth's Paradise** (vocals by Jamaican roots reggae legend **Luciano**); **Follow Me to the Sun** (vocals by Chuck Palmer); **High Atmosphere** (vocals by NPR's **Robin & Linda Williams/Prairie Home Companion**); **Itsbyrne Reel** and **Jacob's Vision** (vocals by Bluegrass legend **Dr. Ralph Stanley/O Brother Where Art Thou**).
